

Rabbi Allen and Cantor Jim Schulman Return for Bet Harim Jewish Community's High Holy Days At Museum at Central School, Kalispell

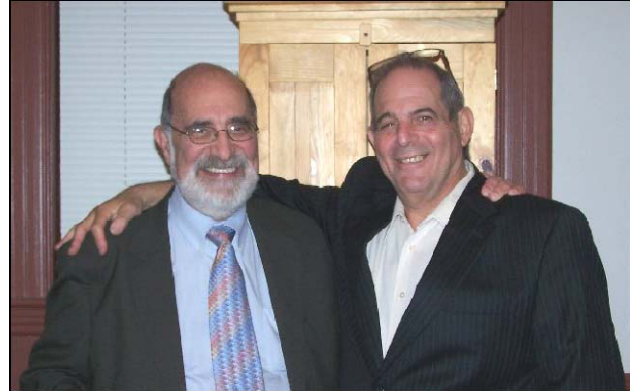

"Last year when Cantor Jim Schulman sang the traditional Kol Nidre Yom Kippur music at High Holy Day services the entire congregation experienced the true spirit of the holidays," says Bet Harim's Rabbi Allen Secher. "Now, Cantor Jim and I will be together again for the Holy Days at Bet Harim Jewish Community of the Flathead Valley which will make the celebration extraordinary for all of us."

Rabbi Allen Secher and Cantor Jim Schulman will conduct services at the Museum at Central School, 124 2nd Ave. East in Kalispell beginning the eve of the Jewish New Year of Rosh Hashanah on Friday, September 18 at 7 pm and continuing the next day, Saturday, September 19 at 10 am. Kol Nidre services will begin promptly at 7 pm on Sunday, September 27 and Yom Kippur services on Monday, September 28 at 10 am. Yizkor service is from 4pm to 6 pm followed by break-the-fast prepared by Bet Harim.

"We've been a team since 1973. We love conducting services together. Jim is an expert song leader with a marvelous voice and a deep sense of spirituality. In the early days, he sang with Debbie Friedman, and more recently was lead singer in Chicago's interfaith gospel choir, Chorale Thunder," said Rabbi Secher.

At the age of 16, Jim Schulman was elected National Song Leader of the Jewish Reform movement's National Federation of Temple Youth camp program. He taught Hebrew songs and Jewish folk tunes to students in the United States, Canada, Mexico and Israel.

Since 1964, Jim has written, produced and performed music all over the world. In 1965, he traveled to Israel as a member of Machon B'Jerusalayim and spent three months teaching Hebrew songs to students in Haifa.

In 1981, Jim began helping people learn to express themselves musically by developing and presenting a seminar called *The Music Inside You*. Ten years later, he joined his old friend and colleague Rabbi Allen as cantor at Congregation Makom Shalom in Chicago's South Loop. Together they created innovative spiritual music for worship in the Jewish Renewal tradition.

Jim is currently a Life Coach, trainer and consultant with the goal of changing and improving the way people communicate with each other. He lives in San Antonio, Texas with his wife Jeanne.

Because Bet Harim is a self-sustaining organization, there is a charge for non-members attending High Holy Day services. Donations for non-members over the age of 13 are \$100 for one holiday's services and \$175 for all services. Tickets for children between 5 to twelve years old are \$20 for one holiday and \$30 for all services.
